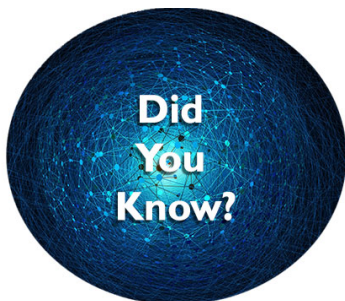

Did You Know?

People blink less when they use computers.

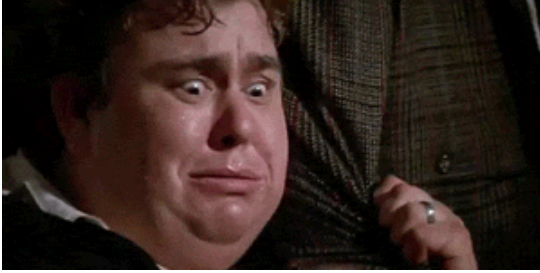
While the average person blinks 15-20 times a minute under normal circumstances, people on computers and other mobile devices only blink about 7 times a minute.

Less blinking means your eyes get drier and you can be straining them.

So here's your reminder to use the **20-20-20 rule**:

Every 20 minutes, look at something 20 feet away for 20 seconds.

This practice helps reset your eyes and can relieve the fatigue that causes headaches, soreness, and blurred vision.

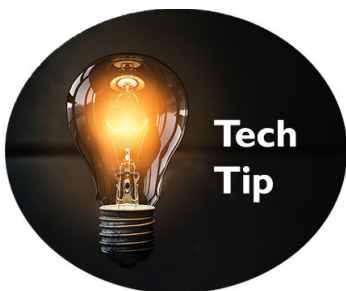
